LEAP courses

If a student requires DSPW0700, DSPR0700 or DSPM 0700, and that student has never enrolled in the basic course, then that student is eligible for the LEAP writing, reading or math course. Students may earn credit for one of their basic course requirements for the LEAP program. Each student, based on a diagnostic assessment, will master skills needed to enroll in 0800 level courses. This is an individualized computer assisted course.

The student needs to access the LEAP course in the schedule by actually going to LEAP writing, reading, or math in the schedule, not the Developmental Studies (DSP) courses.

Financial Aid Moment– Financial Aid FAQ’s for Spring 2012

The financial aid census date for spring 2012 is January 25. In general, the census date is the last day to add classes without special permission. Financial aid for the semester will be based on the student’s credit hours of enrollment on the census date.

If the student enrolls in classes after that date, the additional classes will not be covered by financial aid and the student will be expected to pay for the classes themselves.

So students should register for all classes whether they begin on January 12th or March 12th (the FLEX term) before January 12, 2012 to ensure that their financial aid will apply to all classes for which they register.

For example: Student 1, John, registers on January 2, 2012 for twelve (12) credits. Nine (9) credits begin on January 12th and the remaining three (3) credits begin on March 12th. Since John registered for all his credits prior to January 25, 2012, financial aid will be applied for all 12 credits.

In contrast, student 2, Mary, registers for nine (9) credits on January 2, 2012. Financial Aid covers her tuition and she receives a refund of \$\$\$ based on her nine (9) credits. In February, Mary decides to enroll in a history class that begins on March 12th. Financial aid will not cover this class and Mary will have to pay for the class.
